John Doe earned his Bachelor of Arts at Balloil College, Oxford University, in 1970 and his doctorate from Sussex University in 1973.

In his twenty years at Michigan, Professor Doe has done more than anyone to open faculty and students to an interdisciplinary terrain between the social sciences and the humanities. He has been an institution builder—a co-founder and frequent director of the Program in Comparative Studies of Social Transformations which began in 1987, a principle architect of cooperation in the field of German studies, a stalwart of the long effort to create a viable Center for Western European Studies, an active participant in the Program in Film and Video Studies, and a supporter of a variety of initiatives, including the Women’s Studies Program. He served as the acting director of the Program in Film and Video Studies during fall term 2017.
